B.R.A. Open Forum

This preceded the A.G.M. on Wednesday 7th October 2015 in The Jubilee room of the Village Hall and was chaired by the Vice Chairman Jim Clarke, in the Chairman's absence.

Jim welcomed everyone -residents, members and visitors , the Deputy Mayor of Surrey Heath John Winterton and his wife Diane, Surrey Heath Councillors and Bisley Parish Councillors.

Hester Clarke had been invited to speak by the Committee about the roots of the current B.R.A., as she had been involved in the early stages and was B.R.A. Chairman in the first year, from September 2005.

She gave an overview of the Bisley Parish Plan which ran from 2003 to 2005 and was initiated by Bisley Parish Council. A Steering Committee was set up in September 2003 with eight residents under the chairmanship of Vicki Turton and with a Parish Council representative, John Tilbury.

Bisley residents of all ages, organisations and businesses were consulted using a wide range of approaches, including leaflets, preliminary questionnaires, visits to the school , open days.



The Open Day in the Village Hall in April 2004 was memorable (see pictures). The theme was 'Your Bisley' and was attended by 460 people. Villagers moved through three zones – 'Bisley as it was, as it is and as you

want it to be.' They gave their views regarding the 'hot and grot spots' of living in Bisley. The school art competition was on display and many local organisations participated.



Further consultation followed e.g. with a stall at the Strawberry Fayre and the Steering Committee worked for months on compiling a questionnaire consisting of 73 questions, divided into a range of categories, which was piloted with a sample of households before going out to 1,317 households in Bisley in October 2004. Completed questionnaires were returned three weeks later, data entered, and comments collated over three months in early 2005 by the Steering Committee.

Two reports were then produced – a summary report which was delivered to residents, businesses and local organisations with an invitation to the final Open Day. The main full report with the Proposed Bisley Parish Action Plan (for 2005/2006) was available at the Open Day in May 2005 with visual displays of the findings and recommendations and opportunities to discuss these with the Steering Committee and Parish Council.

The Parish Plan Project was completed and handed over to Bisley Parish Council.

From the Proposed Bisley Parish Action Plan page 1, category 1, 'Information /Communication':-

Action: To establish a Bisley Residents Association to represent the interests of Bisley residents. Commenced September 2005.

Action: B.R.A. to co-ordinate the production of a newsletter to facilitate good communication in the village. Commenced Autumn 2005.

Action: Set up a B.R.A. website to enhance communication. Commenced May 2005.

B.R.A. continues to build on consulting with residents via their two open forums a year, three newsletters a year , the website, and a stall at Strawberry Fayre each June. B.R.A. has strong roots and has contributed much to village life in the past ten years and will continue to do so in the future. Residents of Bisley, please consider joining this organisation to ensure this.

New Bins for Bisley

◆ Bisley Parish Council is in the process of purchasing new closed top bins to replace all the existing bins on the Village Green, Recreation Ground and in the children's play space in Clews Lane. The smart, new bins are dark blue in colour and will take both litter and dog waste. It is hoped that the new bins will be installed before Christmas.

◆ *Petition to Surrey County Council to reduce the speed limit from 40 mph to 30 mph on the A322, from the Gordon's School roundabout to Limecroft Road traffic lights.*

This petition was presented to the Surrey Heath Local Committee in July by Bisley Parish Council. It is expected that a report in response to this issue will be included at the next meeting on 10th December.

Bisley Remembers

With sadness, we report the passing of two much-respected and well-liked Bisley men.

Peter J Fuller (1924-2015) was born and raised in Bisley and, when he died on 4th April 2015, was the oldest Bisley resident. Peter's funeral at St John the Baptist Parish Church, Bisley on 24th April was attended by over 150 relatives, friends and representatives of the many firms, clubs, groups and armed services units with which he had been associated in his long life. His hearse, drawn by two magnificent black horses, was escorted by his family and the Royal British Legion Standard Bearer. Peter was unique in that he had taken part in the ceremony of Beating the Bounds in Bisley on every occasion from 1930 until the latest "Beating" in the Jubilee year 2012. His life was so eventful that several anecdotes of his adventures were printed in the Woking News & Mail after his death.



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William Kerr Boxall (1929- 2015). Kerr sadly died the day before his 86th birthday, after a courageous fight against ill health. We offer our sincere condolences to Catherine, Catriona and their family. Kerr and Catherine have been familiar and well-loved figures in Bisley and beyond, with a wide circle of family, friends, business associates and former Air Force comrades. Kerr's funeral at a crowded St John the Baptist Parish Church, Bisley on 1st September included tributes from his sons, grandchildren, friends and colleagues and Revd.
